

Zunder Opens 64 Ultra-Fast Charging Points in France Along the A63 Landes Highway, the Largest Stations in the Region

Zunder, a leading ultra-fast charging operator in Southern Europe, expands its charging network with two new stations located on the A63 highway in “Les Landes.”

- These two stations, positioned at the “Gateway to Europe,” are part of a key European strategic corridor, connecting the north-south axis for thousands of electric vehicle users.
- The new Zunder stations will provide a total of 64 charging points. Porte de Landes Ouest, inaugurated today, offers 16 operational charging points, while Océan Ouest, opening tomorrow, will also feature 16 charging points, with charging capacities of up to 400 kW. Within a few days, two additional stations will be launched, bringing the total to 64 ultra-fast charging points in the Landes region in time for the summer travel season.

Zunder and Atlandes, the French motorway concession company, officially opened the Porte de Landes Ouest station today and will bring Océan Ouest into service tomorrow. Together, they provide 32 ultra-fast 400 kW charging points for the thousands of users traveling along this corridor connecting Spain and France. Following these, two additional stations—Porte de Landes Est and Océan Est—will be operational within days, completing coverage in both traffic directions and reaching a total of 64 ultra-fast charging points between the Spanish border and Bordeaux.

Expanding Along the Atlantic Corridor

Zunder continues its international expansion by inaugurating two of the largest ultra-fast charging stations on the Atlantic corridor, between Bordeaux and Spain, on the A63 Landes highway. Located at Porte de Landes Ouest and Océan Ouest, each station offers 16 charging points with a maximum capacity of up to 400 kW, including two chargers specifically designed for vehicles with trailers. These stations enable record-breaking charging times, ensuring a fast and seamless experience for all users.

With these new openings, Zunder solidifies its position as a key player in ultra-fast charging, offering a network that empowers EV users to travel freely. The company addresses the growing demand for accessible, reliable, and high-speed charging points. The development of the French stations, completed in less than five months, represents a milestone in building a comprehensive charging network.

Sustainability and Innovation at the Core

The newly opened stations were inaugurated in the presence of Olivier Quoy, CEO of Atlandes, who emphasized the importance of this infrastructure for Atlandes, the region, and its users, as a step forward in promoting more sustainable mobility. Daniel Pérez, CEO and co-founder of Zunder, remarked:

“This project is a significant milestone in Zunder’s international development plan and reflects our commitment to providing a robust network of ultra-fast charging stations. Our goal is to deliver unique solutions and experiences to EV users across Europe, offering ultra-fast chargers and a variety of payment methods.”

Sustainability is a key aspect of this project. By the end of the summer, all stations will feature Zunder’s signature photovoltaic canopies, which not only generate solar energy for their operation but also protect users from sun and weather. Furthermore, the ultra-fast charging stations inaugurated in the Les Landes region are powered entirely by green energy, accessible to all, and tailored to the new generation of electric vehicles.

State-of-the-Art Payment and Future Expansion

Each charging point is equipped with an electronic payment terminal for bank cards and supports the latest technologies, such as the Zunder app, interoperability with other apps, Auto-Charge, Plug&Charge, Apple Watch, Apple CarPlay, and Android Auto.

Looking ahead, these renovated areas are designed to accommodate the future expansion of more charging points, supporting the evolution of electric mobility and addressing the future needs of users.
